## MINUTES - FEBRUARY 8, 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

A meeting of the Council of the Delaware Association of Professional Engineers was held on Wednesday February 8, 2023 in hybrid format (at DAPE office and via Zoom).

The Roll call was taken and a quorum was declared.

Meeting was called to order at 3:09 PM.

<u>Open Forum</u> – N. Batta attended the meeting briefly to inform Council that he has resigned from the Chemical engineering seat because he does not reside in Delaware. He intends to remain on the Nominating Committee, and has offered to help identify a replacement.

# Minutes of the January 11, 2023 Council Meetings

Council reviewed the Minutes of the January 11, 2023 Council meeting.

Motion by C. McAllister, seconded by D. Barbato, to approve the minutes of the January 11, 2023 meeting. Approved unanimously.

## D.A.G. Report

- DAG Kelly has reached out to DAGs from DelDOT and DNREC to get feedback on proposed legislative amendment. Representatives from DelDOT plan to attend the March 1, 2023 LEE Committee meeting. DAG Kelly relayed feedback to DAG Mulveny about the term "engineering community" used in the proposed amendment.
- DAG Kelly has researched other licensing boards in Delaware to see if they have a Delaware residency requirement and reported that most do. Government Affairs & Bylaws Committee will review data about how many members list various engineering disciplines and make a recommendation to modify the Council composition. The Committee discussed either changing the Chemical Engineering

- seat to "Chemical/Environmental" or removing the Chemical Engineering seat and changing to two "Other" seats.
- DAG Kelly will provide input to the Government Affairs & Bylaws Committee on DAPE's agreement with lobbyist Mary Davis. The Committee will make a recommendation to Council for an updated contract.

## Financial Reports

K. Maxson summarized DAPE's finances for the nine months (75%) of fiscal year ending April 30, 2023, which reflect income has reached 92.9% of projections and expenses 70.1%. J. Wootten will schedule a committee meeting to begin work on new budget. All committees should consider activities that will impact the budget.

Motion by K. Maxson, seconded by D. Reinhold, Council accepts the Finance Report subject to audit. Approved unanimously.

# <u>Finance/Employee Compensation & Benefits Committee/Facilities Committee – No Report</u>

### Law Enforcement/Ethics Committee

C. McAllister reported that the committee met on February 1, 2023 and discussed the following:

- Leaislative amendment update. Committee would like to receive feedback in writing.
- PE renewal questions regarding disclosing disciplinary action (question regarding COA requirements)
- Ethics training for spring 2023. Topics may include: COA requirements, requirements for disclosing
  discipline in other jurisdictions, LEE complaint process, recent DAPE case studies. J. Wootten will
  finalize a date and location, and recruit a few panelists to help with presentation. This may
  include additional training for LEE Committee members and Council members.

- Amended proposed administrative order to be discussed under "Old Business."
- M. Davis recommends finalizing language by mid-April at the latest; if the successor engineer language is not resolved by then, Council could consider moving forward with only part of the amendment this year.

### **New Business**

- DelDOT Bridge Design Competition on April 27th at the Chase Center in Wilmington. DAPE will have a
  display to talk to students about pursuing a PE license. A few volunteers are needed to help with this
  effort. J. Wootten will order some mechanical pencils to give away at the table, and call N. Dean to
  discuss potential financial support from DAPE, such as funding breakfast or lunch.
- NSPE Delaware Chapter MathCounts on March 28<sup>th</sup> (location TBD). J. Wootten will reach out to
  J. Taylor to discuss potential financial support from DAPE, such as funding breakfast or lunch, and a
  DAPE display at the event.
- Random CPC Audit
  - o Since June 30, 2022 we've completed 137 CPC audits, with an additional 28 in process
  - Active roster is 8016 (CPC Guidelines state that DAPE will conduct a random audit of up to 5% (approximately 400 members). J. Wootten will create a random audit list of 150 members, and send out notices in 2 batches in the upcoming weeks.
  - o Discussed requiring members to upload a completed PDH log during future online renewals.
- M. Clendaniel hopes to appoint someone to the open Chemical Engineering seat at the March meeting. That individual would serve through the end of August 31. The Chemical Engineering seat will be on the 2023 Council election ballot for DAPE members to elect an individual to serve out the rest of the term, and again in 2025 when this seat was scheduled for the election. Send ideas for potential candidates to M. Clendaniel.
